The Cuts

- \$46 Million in Tuition Aid Grants - All Students
- \$2 Million in Tuition Aid Grants - County College Students
- \$1.1 Million for Student Tuition Assistance Reward Scholarships - High School Students
- \$240 Million for Rutgers University
- 317 Jobs at Rutgers University
- 400 Jobs at the University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey
- 600 Jobs at Other State Colleges and Universities
- \$10 Million from the Transportation Trust Fund
- \$10 Million from the Local Aid and Infrastructure Fund
- \$10 Million from the Public Transportation Fund
- \$2 Million for New Jersey Network
- \$20 in Legal Aid Funds
- \$10M for Legal Representation for the Poor in Non-Criminal cases
- \$2 Million from the Lead Hazard Control Assistance Program
- \$50 Million for Municipal Public Safety Aid
- \$139 Million in Transitional Aid to Municipalities - \$69M for Camden; \$27M for Trenton
- \$4 Million in Legislative Staff Salaries - \$3M in the State Senate; \$1M in the State Assembly
- \$4 Million for the Department of Environmental Protection - includes cuts to grant funded
- \$7.5 Million for Family Planning Services - All Providers
- \$6 Million for Trauma Centers
- \$8 Million for Early Childhood Intervention Programs
- \$7 Million for AIDS Drug Distribution Programs
- Supplemental appropriation for enhanced school aid - VETOED by the governor
- Tax Credit for Senior Pensions - VETOED by the governor
- Restoration of Earned Income Tax Credit for Low-Income Workers - VETOED by the governor
- Funding for "After 3" - an After-School Program for Children from Low-Income Families

The Non-Cuts

- Increase of tax rate on top incomes from 8.97% to 10.75% - VETOED by the governor
